Oil tops \$110, equities sink on rising Ukraine war fears; crude surged past \$110 a barrel Wednesday and equities sank with investors growing increasingly fearful about the Ukraine war's impact on global energy supplies and the economic recovery. **Story**

<u>Uganda in talks to rescue citizens in Ukraine</u>; Uganda is engaging state and non-state actors to help rescue its citizens stranded in Ukraine as the war between Kyiv and Moscow enters the fifth day. <u>Story</u>

NSSF mid-term access rules leak; the long-awaited regulations prescribing the procedure for accessing NSSF mid-term benefits are expected to be gazette this Friday, with the Fund management saying actual payment could start next Monday. <u>Story</u>
