Gov't orders striking teachers back to work; the government has ordered striking teachers to return to their duty stations by June 24, without fail or risk being scrapped off the payrolls. The Public Service PS, Catherine Bitarakwate Musingwiire communicated the decision in her letter to UNATU, which announced the industrial action. [Story](#)
